B. APPRAISER'S OFFICE: Bulk Mailing – Valuation Notices:

-After reviewing options, the Appraiser's Office has determined that using The Master's Touch to create valuation notices, mailing labels and envelopes is the most effective method for printing and mailing.

Barbara Esfeld, County Appraiser, said the state requires them to value all real estate except farm ground. Esfeld said the Appraiser's Office contacted everyone they knew of in the United States (Komtek, Postalocity, Masters Touch and Mail Services, LLC) to provide a quote to print and mail the Certified Valuation Notices. Komtek quoted \$8,473.72, Master's Touch quoted \$6,500 and Mail Services quoted \$7,600.

Esfeld said last year was the first year to use Master's Touch and were very satisfied with the job performed and the savings of \$1,100 as compared to Mail Services. Esfeld said if they were to mail inhouse it would cost approximately \$10,000 including postage but not including staff time.

Commissioner Schartz moved to hire The Master's Touch at a cost not to exceed \$6,500.00 for bulk mailing Certificates of Valuation Notices for 2020. Cost to be paid from the Appraiser's account of the General Fund, Professional Service Fee's Line – 001-14-5475. Commissioner Daily seconded the motion. All voted aye. Motion passed.

C. MATCHING FUND REQUEST: SouthWest Kansas Area Agency on Aging:

-The SouthWest Kansas Area Agency on Aging (SWKAAA) is requesting matching funds from Barton nty in the amount of \$1,500.00. These funds, which would be used as "Seed Dollars", are an equivalent match to the \$429,382.00 in services received by older residents and low income families from

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Barton County. The County has traditionally provided this match from the Finance General Account of the General Fund.

Phil Hathcock, County Administrator, described SWKAAA services and requested approval.

Commissioner Daily moved to authorize 2020 funding to SWKAAA in the amount of \$1,500.00. Payment to be made from the Finance General account of the General Fund, SWKAAA Line, 001-26-6930. Commissioner Schartz seconded the motion. All voted aye. Motion passed.

D. COUNTY WEBSITE: SOCS - Simplified Online Communication System:

-For the past several years, Barton County's website, <u>www.bartoncounty.org</u>, has been hosted by SOCS. In 2019, County personnel worked to update the site. It is suggested that the County enter into another three-year period for services at a cost of \$5,225.00 per year. It is noted that the cost remains unchanged from the 2017 renewal.

Phil Hathcock, County Administrator, said SOCS host our website and keep it updated. BJ Wooding and Judy Goreham work with our website and updated it last year. This is a three-year contract that is paid annually.

Commissioner Schartz said this contract price didn't change.

Commissioner Schartz moved to approve the contract agreement submitted by SOCS for the Barton County Website for a period of three years beginning January 28, 2020 and ending January 27, 2023 at a t of \$5,225.00 annually. The annual cost of \$5,225.00, is to be paid from General Finance, Economic velopment – 001-26-6880.

Commissioner Kruckenberg seconded the motion.

All voted ave. Motion passed.

E. KANSAS ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES: 2020 Membership:

-The Kansas Association of Counties (KAC) has submitted a renewal notice for the 2020 membership. Based on a calculation that includes a base fee, population and valuation, the dues are \$6,147.03. The Association sponsors the annual KAC Conference, various educational meetings throughout the year and lobbies the State and Federal Legislature on behalf of Kansas Counties.

Phil Hathcock, County Administrator, said KAC was founded in 1975. Hathcock said several county departments are also members of KAC. The \$100 webinar fee is not included.

Commissioner Daily asked if anyone attended the webinars last year. Hathcock said very few.

Commissioner Schartz said we very seldom get something for \$100 and said it could be beneficial.

Hathcock said he visited with Dereck about recording for playback at a more convenient time.

The KLPG serves as a policy and decision making body establishing legislative priorities at its annual meeting and providing speakers to address KLPG members about the important topics of the day. At this time, the Commission will consider renewal of the membership, priced at \$4,993.56.

Phil Hathcock, County Administrator, said this is another group we have historically belonged to. KLPG is a bi-partisan group of western Kansas counties and noted Commissioner Schartz has been attending the meetings. The KLPG group is responsible in getting the oil depletion money back to the county.

Commissioner Schartz said she got a lot out of the meeting she attended last fall and said she will be attending their meeting in Topeka on Tuesday.

Commissioner Schartz moved to approve the 2020 KLPG Membership Dues of \$4,993.56. Payment to be made from the Courthouse General Account of the General Fund, Dues, Memberships, Subscriptions Line, 001-18-5455.
