Commissioner Hutchinson said he spoke to Luke McCormick, Great Bend Fire Department, and he wanted to thank the citizens for their patience and understanding.

Wendy Prosser, County Appraiser, said the county felt the details in the decision were not what had occurred and asked for reconsideration but were denied. The county took it to the Court of Appeals. A full transcript was requested and was just being finished to go the Court of Appeals. Waiting for a final decision. No tax dollars had been refunded yet until the process was completed.

Commissioner Schartz asked Prosser for the amount of taxes. Prosser said for 2020 and 2021, without any interest, it was approximately \$26,212.00.
